## GRADUATE ONLINE TUITION AND FEES

Tuition for the MBA, MSA, and MSM programs is \$441.00 per quarter credit hour; tuition for the graduate education, MSCJ, and MPH programs is \$385.00 per quarter credit hour; tuition for the MSLS, MSN, and MSP programs is \$368.00 per quarter credit hour; tuition for the MSIT program is \$402.00 per quarter credit hour; and tuition for the MHCA program is \$420.00 per quarter credit hour. Active-duty servicemembers will receive the following tuition reductions per quarter credit hour: MBA, MSA, and MSM programs—\$84.00; graduate education, MSCJ, and MPH programs—\$87.50; MSLS, MSN, and MSP programs—\$70.50; MSIT program—\$91.75; and MHCA program—\$63.00. Military veterans will receive the following tuition reductions per quarter credit hour: MBA, MSA, and MSM programs—\$71.00; graduate education, MSCJ, and MPH programs—\$62.50; MSLS, MSN, and MSP programs—\$45.50; MSIT program—\$69.00; and MHCA program—\$50.00. Kaplan University is also participating in the Yellow Ribbon program, which may provide additional VA funding up to the reduced tuition amounts provided by the University. Active military includes members of the Reserve or National Guard on drill status.

Spouses of active-duty servicemembers are eligible for a 10 percent discount on graduate program tuition. Discounts may not be used in conjunction with scholarships or other discounts. Books and other instructional materials are not included.

Not all programs are available in all states. Check with an Admissions Advisor.

The following tuition and fee information applies to all students:

1. (a) Learning Center and campus students: A \$20.00 enrollment fee is due at the time this agreement is completed. If the applicant is not accepted for any reason excluding unsatisfactory results on a required criminal background check, or if the student cancels this contract within three business days, this fee will be refunded. Otherwise, it is nonrefundable.
- (b) All other students: A minimum deposit of \$80.00 is required at the time of enrollment to secure the student's place in class. If the student begins classes, the deposit will be credited to the first quarter's tuition. The deposit is refundable for first-time students if cancellation of enrollment is received by the University seven days prior to the start of the term. If eligible, the refund will be processed within 30 days upon receipt of the cancellation notice.
2. Active-duty military personnel and military veterans are not eligible for Kaplan University scholarships, tuition vouchers, or discounts.
3. All students are required to pay a \$100.00 technology fee per term. For the MBA, MSA, and MSM programs and MSIT students during the Project Management specialization courses, this fee is prorated to \$50 per six-week term.
4. Tuition and fees are subject to change after 30 days' advance notice. See the current University Catalog for an explanation of the Refund Policy.
5. Tuition payments can be made at the following website: [kaplanuniversity.edu](http://kaplanuniversity.edu). Log on to KU Campus and select the "Make Payment" link.
6. A \$10.00 fee will be added for all returned checks.
7. Tuition is payable in full every term.
8. Failure to return library materials to Kaplan University or any of its partner libraries will result in a financial obligation to Kaplan University and may result in postponement of registration for a new term or graduation.
9. With the exception of Learning Center and campus students, for returning students a nonrefundable deposit of \$25.00 is required at the time of enrollment. Once the student begins classes, the deposit will be credited to the first term's tuition.

10. A fee of \$50.00 is required for each Challenge Exam taken. In addition, a fee of \$25.00 per credit will be charged for the awarding of approved credit to the student's record.
11. Students who graduate from the University will receive one free copy of their official transcript. A fee of \$5.00 is charged for each additional copy.
12. Master of Business Administration students will pay a one-time fee of \$84.50 as part of GB 500 (\$64.50 for Insights Discovery Profile and \$20.00 for Marketplace Business Simulation); Master of Science in Management students will pay a one-time fee of \$64.50 prior to the start of GM 500 (Insights Discovery Profile). Master of Health Care Administration students will pay a one-time program fee of \$300.00. These fees may be paid using financial aid funds and can be incorporated into the student's monthly payment plan.
13. Applicants to the Master of Arts in Teaching Iowa Certification program who do not have a currently active Iowa Substitute Authorization or a currently active Coaching Authorization will be required to complete a background check. The cost is \$54.00 and is the responsibility of the applicant. The fee is nonrefundable. Master of Arts in Teaching Iowa Certification students will pay a Praxis I fee of approximately \$130.00 in the first term.
14. In order to attend a graduate program at Kaplan University, students must have earned a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university and attest to that fact. As part of the Enrollment Packet, students must certify that they graduated from such an institution. Prior to the end of the first term (second term for MBA, MSA, and MSM students) the student will be required to provide official transcripts from this institution. If, for any reason, this attestation and unofficial transcript are found to be false or untrue or official transcripts are not provided, the student will be subject to immediate dismissal from Kaplan University. Furthermore, all Title IV financial aid or any state or institutional funding must be refunded to the appropriate source, and the student will be responsible for payment of these funds to the original source or to Kaplan University.

## CALIFORNIA RESIDENTS

The State of California created the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) to relieve or mitigate economic losses suffered by California residents who were students attending certain schools regulated by the Bureau for Private Postsecondary and Vocational Education.

You must pay the state-imposed assessment for the STRF (\$2.50 per \$1,000.00 of institutional charges rounded to the nearest \$1,000.00) if all of the following applies to you:

1. You are a student who is a California resident and prepays all or part of your tuition either by cash, guaranteed student loans, or personal loans, and
2. Your total charges are not paid by any third-party payer such as an employer, government program, or other payer unless you have a separate agreement to repay the third party.

You are not eligible for protection from the STRF and you are not required to pay the STRF assessment if either of the following applies:

1. You are not a California resident.
2. Your total charges are paid by a third party, such as an employer, government program, or other payer, and you have no separate agreement to repay the third party.

You may be eligible for STRF if you are a California resident, prepaid tuition, paid the STRF assessment, and suffered an economic loss as a result of any of the following:

1. The school closed before the course of instruction was completed.
2. The school's failure to pay refunds or charges on behalf of a student to a third party for license fees or any other purpose, or to provide equipment or materials for which a charge was collected within 180 days before the closure of the school.

3. The school's failure to pay or reimburse loan proceeds under a federally guaranteed student loan program as required by law or to pay or reimburse proceeds received by the school prior to closure in excess of tuition and other costs.
4. There was a decline in the quality of the course of instruction within 30 days before the school closed or, if the decline began earlier than 30 days prior to closure, the period of decline determined by the Bureau.
5. An inability to collect on a judgment against the institution for a violation of the Act.
6. The school closed before the course of instruction was completed.
7. The school's failure to pay refunds or charges on behalf of a student to a third party for license fees or any other purpose, or to provide equipment or materials for which a charge was collected within 180 days before the closure of the school.
8. The school's failure to pay or reimburse loan proceeds under a federally guaranteed student loan program as required by law or to pay or reimburse proceeds received by the school prior to closure in excess of tuition and other costs.
9. There was a decline in the quality of the course of instruction within 30 days before the school closed or, if the decline began earlier than 30 days prior to closure, the period of decline determined by the Bureau.
10. An inability to collect on a judgment against the institution for a violation of the Act.
