Pursue a specialization that could help you prepare for a career as a nurse practitioner, nurse administrator, nurse educator, or nurse who works in the field of informatics.¹

• Adult-Gerontology Nurse Practitioner⁴

This specialization is designed to help professional nurses promote holistic health care to the adult population, and diagnose and manage the population's acute and chronic health problems. At this time, the adult-gerontology nurse practitioner specialization is available only in the following states: Alaska, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Iowa, Michigan, Mississippi, Montana, Nebraska, Ohio, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, and Vermont.

• Family Nurse Practitioner⁴

This specialization is designed to help professional nurses promote holistic health care to adults and children in a family context. At this time, the family nurse practitioner specialization is available only in the following states: Alaska, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Iowa, Michigan, Mississippi, Montana, Nebraska, Ohio, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, and Vermont.

• Nurse Educator

This specialization is designed to prepare graduates to take the National League for Nursing's Certified Nurse Educator (CNE) exam and pursue faculty positions in schools of nursing.²

• Nurse Administrator

This specialization is designed to prepare graduates to take the Nurse Executive certification exam provided by the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC).² This certification may lead to career opportunities that include administrative, managerial, and leadership roles in hospitals and health care facilities.

• Informatics

This specialization prepares graduates to use technology and information systems to advance evidence-based practice. In addition, this specialization could provide graduates with the opportunity to pursue informatics leadership roles in a variety of health care and/or education settings, and prepare them to take the ANCC's Informatics Nursing certification exam.²



Certificate Programs⁴

The School of Nursing also offers the following certificate programs for RNs who already possess a master's degree in nursing:

- Adult-Gerontology Nurse Practitioner Certificate
- Family Nurse Practitioner Certificate

Program Detail

Total Quarter Credit Hours: 63, 90, or 100 (Students who choose to complete the adult-gerontology nurse practitioner specialization or the family nurse practitioner specialization will complete 55 or 65 quarter credits of specialization courses, respectfully, for a program total of 90 or 100 quarter credit hours)

Program Length: Students could finish in as little as 18 to 24 months.⁶

Admissions Requirements:

- A Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) from an accredited college or university
- An active RN license in a U.S. state
- A "C" grade or better in a statistics and a nursing research course completed at an accredited college or university (NOTE: You can take these courses during your first term)
- A current, professional resume that verifies the applicant has worked a minimum of 1,000 clinical hours as a registered nurse (required for the adult-gerontology nurse practitioner and family nurse practitioner specializations)

³NCLEX-RN® is a registered trademark of the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, Inc.

⁴The online Master of Science in Nursing program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). At this time, the CCNE does not accredit certificate programs such as the Adult-Gerontology Nurse Practitioner Certificate or Family Nurse Practitioner Certificate. Please note that most states require nurses to be nationally certified in order to obtain licensure as a nurse practitioner. Students graduating from unaccredited programs are not eligible to sit for the national certification exams provided by the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) or American Academy of Nurse Practitioners (AANP). Students are responsible for determining whether they will be eligible for state Board of Nursing approval and certification as a nurse practitioner or advanced practice nurse in their state. Students can obtain additional information from their state's Board of Nursing, the ANCC, and the AANP.

Due to the number of different certification organizations and the individual state requirements related to nurse practitioner responsibilities, completion of the adult-gerontology nurse practitioner or family nurse practitioner specialization or certificate does not imply or guarantee certification or licensure. Students are responsible for the investigation of the qualifications and requirements for certification and/or licensure in their specific location.

⁵Note: a practicum experience must be completed in a facility selected by the student.

⁶Average completion time based on a full-time schedule. Programs will take longer for part-time students to complete. The number of required credits may vary depending on individual state education requirements, which could affect how long it will take to complete the program.

⁷Classes will count toward a student's degree if satisfactorily completed. No credits are earned if the student withdraws during the introductory period. The introductory period is five weeks, and begins on day one of the student's first academic term. If at any point during the introductory period a student chooses to opt out, he or she will have no other obligation to the University except for the application fee. Only available to new students; continuing students are not eligible.
